Dr. Anna Oswald is a rheumatologist and associate professor at the University of Alberta with cross appointment to the Faculty of Education. Her training includes: MD (U of A), core Internal Medicine residency (Dalhousie), Rheumatology subspecialty (U of A), 1 year Visiting Scholar Medical Education (McGill) and a Masters in Medical Education (University of Dundee).
